Key Duties and responsibilities: Individually or as part of a team and under the general direction of senior colleagues:

- . Provide an efficient and effective arboricultural service Including the following:
 - Tree Planting and aftercare
 - Felling trees
 - Aerial tree works including pruning, crown reduction and section felling on occasions working at heights more than 20 meters
 - Tree stump grinding
 - Herbicide treatment
 - · Single and multiple windblown and broken stems during and following storms
 - · Visual ground and aerial inspections of trees to identify defects, pests, and disease.
 - Proactive approach to self-development and keeping up to date with working knowledge of best practice, relevant legislation and standards associated with the area of work.

All the above works to designated standards and in accordance with predetermined schedules, ensuring full compliance with all risk assessments and health & safety requirements.

- 2. As necessary, drive and operate a range of specialist vehicles & equipment including:
 - 3.5T Vehicles, Category (B)
 - 7.5T Vehicles, Category (C) (CE)
 - Mobile elevating work platforms (International Powered Access Federation)
 - Stump Grinders (National Proficiency Test Council/Lantra)
 - Tracked & Tow behind chippers (National Proficiency Test Council/Lantra)
- 3. Complete all necessary documentation to accurately record the resources used and progress of work in accordance with corporate procedures.
- 5. Ensure the safety of other employees and the public in relation to the work undertaken including the safe use of all plant, equipment and tools and the provision of a safe working area (including setting out appropriate traffic management measures)
- 6. Interact with service users, members of the public, colleagues, and councillors in a courteous and respectful manner.

- 7. Ensure all work is completed within the allocated time and to specified quality and service standards.
- 8. Contribute to the creation of risk assessments and method statements to ensure work is performed in a safe and responsible manner, within specified ground rules.
- 9. Work collaboratively with management and team colleagues to ensure that work plans are achieved, and quality standards are maintained.
- 10. Comply with detailed and sometimes complex spoken and written instructions, drawings, and plans.
- 11. Carry out routine vehicle driver and equipment operator checks in accordance with established procedures.
- 12. Staff will be expected to work across Neighbourhood Services frontline services as required.

The duties and responsibilities highlighted in this job description are indicative and may vary over time and there will be a requirement to attend refresher training to ensure the employee keeps up to date with industry changes. Post holders are expected to undertake other duties and responsibilities relevant to the nature, level and extent of the post, and the grade has been established on this basis.

Work Arrangements

Physical requirements:	Predominantly standing or climbing using rope & harness access and MEWPS, with frequent walking, frequent ongoing lifting and carrying heavy items, pulling, and pushing, often on uneven ground and difficult terrain. Need to remain alert for traffic and other potential hazards. Capable of complying with the physical demands of the posts and with special awareness when working with chainsaws and specialist equipment.
Transport requirements: Working patterns:	Need to attend training and development/refresher courses, meetings or other work sites as required. Normal working week, Monday to Friday, with occasional evening, weekend and emergency call out work. Driving regulations apply, where applicable.
Working conditions:	Extensive exposure to working outdoors in all weathers and traffic, with exposure to specific hazardous situations for which the wearing and use of specialist protective clothing and equipment will be required. Due to geographical area this can lead to working in remote locations.
